## The school

Founded in 1945 by Ena Makin, The Granville School is a thriving, successful prep school with an enviable reputation for excellence. The school is set in five acres of gardens and woodland and is centred around a large, attractive Victorian house. Over the past years, several new specialist buildings have been added so that it is now an impressive campus with exceptional, purpose-built facilities.

The school benefits from being close to a mainline station (30 minutes from London) and the busy market town of Sevenoaks. The Granville School is a non-selective, day preparatory school for girls aged 3 to 11 and boys aged 3 and 4. An educational trust administered by an extremely supportive Board of Governors.

The Granville is an exceptional school which combines the very best of prep school tradition with a vibrant, forward-looking outlook where change is embraced and innovation celebrated. Pupils thrive on individual attention and achieve their best in a happy, secure and stimulating environment. Highly qualified, specialist teachers make learning exciting, develop enquiring minds and raise levels of expectation.

Every year, pupils participate in uniquely Granville festivals. These all help to reinforce both a strong family community and a warm, friendly atmosphere, which are highly valued by pupils, parents and staff. While the school is non-selective, it successfully nurtures the potential in every pupil and each year the girls achieve impressive results academically as well as in sport, music, drama and art.

Many girls gain scholarships to a wide range of excellent senior schools, (including Caterham, Kent College, Sevenoaks, Walthamstow Hall and Woldingham) as well as places at Kent grammar schools. The Head is a member of the Independent Association of Prep Schools (IAPS) and the school is inspected by ISI.

The most recent ISI inspection took place in 2017 and the school was proud to be rated 'excellent' in all areas. The full inspection report can be read on the school's website. Looking to the future, the school aims to continue on its journey of excellence, constantly aiming to improve the standard of teaching and learning, and helping pupils achieve their personal best. There is also a major building and development project on the horizon, to further improve the school's facilities.



## Beyond the classroom

At The Granville, we believe that examination success is not solely the end goal of a pupil's journey through school. Rather, it is an enriching academic and extra-curricular experience that allows our pupils to fully develop their skills, confidence, creativity and character, instilling in them a lifelong love of learning and a firm belief that anything is possible. Experienced, dedicated teachers offer a supportive, encouraging and challenging environment in which to learn, that allows pupils to achieve success that not even they dreamed possible.

Though large enough to ensure academic rigour and excellent facilities, the school is small enough for the Headmistress and members of staff to know every girl personally and as an individual. ## Job description: Head of English (Maternity Cover)

The Granville is looking for an inspirational and dynamic teacher to continue and develop our highly successful English department.

The successful candidate will be a qualified teacher of English ready to move into a leadership role, or with existing experience of leading a flourishing English department in another school. The ability to prepare pupils for 11+ examinations is essential.

### Key areas of responsibility

To develop the English curriculum for all pupils, and to promote and develop opportunities for all children to make progress.

To plan and provide a stimulating and motivating learning environment ensuring that the learning resources are well organised and accessible to staff and pupils.

To develop the department with due regard to the school's policies and schemes of work, working closely with and co-ordinating the efforts of all school English teachers.

To prepare pupils for 11+ examinations, running extra sessions when necessary.

To maintain detailed records of pupils.

To liaise regularly with the Headmistress on matters relating to the teaching of English at every level of the school.

To lead in collaborative decision making within the English department.

To play a full part in the life of the school, liaising with other members of staff when appropriate.

To work with learning development in identifying AGT pupils and provide pupils with opportunities in and out of the classroom for extension and enrichment, and scholarship preparation.



### Key areas of responsibility (cont.)

To work with learning development in identifying pupils who need support and provide pupils with appropriate work which supports their needs.

To remain up to date in current curriculum development and professional practice by regular attendance at courses in consultation with the Headmistress.

To lead and facilitate staff training and development.

To promote English through a range of extra-curricular activities.

To maintain and organise the school libraries with support from other members of staff.

Promote reading through the organisation of book fairs, author visits and World Book Day events.

To use information technology to assist lesson preparation, teaching and reporting.

To manage the English budget.

Co-ordinate poetry for the spring festival.
